List of language features you need to know for the exam:

Rhetorical question - is a question asked where the answer is obvious or implied. The effect is to involve the audience and create an emotional response from them. **Imagery** - creates images in the mind.

Simile - two unlike things are compared, using 'like' or 'as'

Personification - is a metaphor where an object/idea is given human qualities. **Imperative -** Words that command the reader or listener to do something. Often used in speeches and advertising.

Cliché - Words, phrases or ideas that are over-used

Assonance - the repetition of vowel sounds in words near to each other.

Metaphor - a direct comparison. Rather than saying something is "like" something else, it says it **is**

Onomatopoeia - words whose meaning is suggested in their sound

Pun - an expression where two meanings are suggested by the same word, or similar sounding words. Often used for humour.

Alliteration - Words starting with the same letter/sound

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
